You will find it rewarding to work with others on the committee. We all aim to support a friendly club environment that caters for all aspects of the game, from beginners to advanced and competitive players.

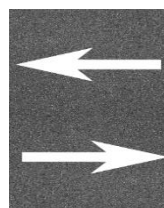
We invite you to bring your lunch and stay for the afternoon session.

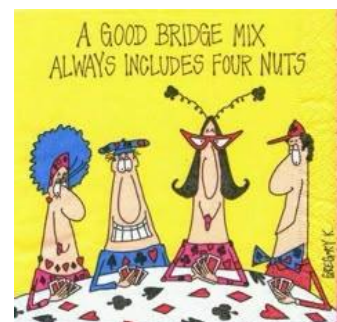


Saturday Social Bridge

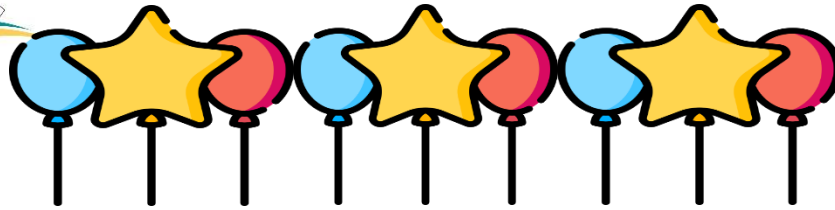

RHP is a local registered charity that offers a therapy program developed in the US, which is highly successful in moderating sufferers' speech/swallowing difficulties and can actually prolong lives.

RHP operates on a shoe string from a church hall in Burnside. They have now been offered more suitable dedicated premises in Buddina by Sunshine Coast Regional Council. Grant and sponsorship income paid for the roof and insulation to be replaced, but another \$50,000 is needed to make the new premises fit for purpose. They hope to move in within a few months.

Parkinson's is affecting younger people now at an alarming rate. This is an opportunity to be proactive and to help in a practical capacity not just for now but the future.
